BackGround:

Present mainly in the mitochondrial compartment of peripheral tissues, the protein encoded by this gene interacts with some benzodiazepines and has different affinities than its endogenous counterpart. The protein is a key factor in the flow of cholesterol into mitochondria to permit the initiation of steroid hormone synthesis.




Store at 4 °C short term. Aliquot and store at -20 °C long term. Avoid freeze-thaw cycles.
